

IPNA Best Practices & Standards Committee

The mission of the BPS committee is to create and distribute Clinical Practice Recommendations (CPRs) and Standard of Care developed or endorsed by IPNA for the management of children with kidney diseases for physicians, patients and their families.

Tasks:

The main priorities of the BPS committee are:

- 1) Creating CPRs and defining Standard of Care for important kidney diseases by IPNA expert groups involving pediatric nephrologists from all IPNA regional societies, other subspecialities involved in the management of specific diseases, and patient representatives.
- 2) Developing and promoting IPNA Webinars devoted to Clinical Practice/Guidelines and aligning these with Webinars from ASPN, ESPN, ERKNET and ISN.
- 3) Distribute CPRs and Standard of Care through workshops, and conferences (regional societies, IPNA congress, IPNA teaching courses, and local meetings), and by publishing CPRs developed or endorsed by IPNA on the IPNA webpage.
- 4) Contribute to the program of IPNA congress.

 The BPS committee operates through online teaching activities, regular video conferences, and in-person meetings (with call-in options) at regularly scheduled IPNA meetings.

Special requirements:

- 1. From regions so far not represented in the committee.
- 2. Experience in conducting systematic review and meta-analysis
- 3. Training in GRADE methodology for guideline development
- 4. Past experience in formulating evidence-based clinical practice guidelines



IPNA Communication Committee

Tasks:

The Communications Committee oversees efforts of the Association that relate to letting the membership know what is happening. The primary efforts of the Committee include looking after the websites of both the Association (theipna.org) and the Foundation (ipnafoundation.org); development and dissemination of the newsletter (published six times a year); and organizing the social media presence and inititatives (including a Twitter-based journal club). The Committee is currently also active in carrying out the recent strategic plan and most recently has been involved in discussions about the development of an app for IPNA.

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IPNA Professional Education Committee

Tasks:

The mission of the PEC is to provide high quality IPNA sponsored pediatric nephrology education for pediatric nephrologists, pediatric nephrology trainees and physicians who care for children with kidney disorders.

The 4 main priorities of the PEC are:



- 1)Sponsoring (approving and funding) IPNA Teaching Courses that provide high value education about pediatric nephrology topics for physicians, trainees and allied health professionals in less developed areas of the world
- 2) Developing and implement advanced Pediatric Nephrology Master Classes for pediatric nephrology trainees and pediatric nephrologists
- 3) Developing and promoting IPNA Webinars devoted to Clinical Practice/Guidelines and aligning these with Webinars from ASPN and ERKNET
- 4) Contributing to the educational plan and innovative programs at 2025 IPNA Congress in Cape Town
- 5) Developing IPNA Global Educational Curriculum

The PEC operates through online evaluations of proposed teaching activities, regular conference calls and in person meetings (with call in options) at regularly scheduled IPNA meetings.

IPNA Sister Center Committee

Tasks:

The remit of the Sister Centers Committee is to identify "mentor centres" in well-resourced regions to establish renal units on a 1 to 1 basis (with priority to centres from Emerging Countries and preference to support previously trained IPNA/ISN fellows) and supervise the whole programme.

The aim of this programme is to assist in improving:

Clinical training of staff (medical, nursing and allied health staff) involved in caring for children with kidney disease

Developing and upgrading services for children with kidney diseases

Education into the community for preventative strategies



Clinical research development.
